

# Redistricting New Jersey

## after the Census of 2010



**T**he Census of 2010 has the potential for changing New Jersey's 13 Congressional districts, 40 state Legislative districts, freeholder districts in three counties, municipal wards in more than 60 municipalities, membership on 70 regional boards of education, and election districts throughout the state. A wide array of public and political party officials will have duties and responsibilities that they normally encounter only once a decade. A new publication, *Redistricting New Jersey after the Census of 2010*, from the Center for Government Services outlines the constitutional and statutory procedures and tasks that they will face and suggests the type of changes that may have to be made.
